

## Glenwild Holiday Lighting Guidelines

***The following Holiday Lighting Guidelines have been established to assist the Glenwild Community in balancing individual expression, celebration and, minimal neighborly impact while complying with the Summit County Dark Sky Ordinance.***

### **General Lighting Considerations**

The Association asks homeowners to be mindful of neighbors and the community in general when planning holiday lighting. A tasteful and modest lighting display can be enjoyable to those within the specific residence while not being overly obtrusive. As more homes are completed and occupied during the winter holidays it becomes imperative to design and install a conservative lighting display so that the overall visual impact of the community remains tasteful and subdued.

#### **1. Installation/Removal Time Period:**

Holiday Lighting may be illuminated from **November 1st through March 1st**. Due to winter weather and lighting contractor schedules, lighting may be installed prior to November 1<sup>st</sup> and removed after March 31<sup>st</sup>, but activation will be limited to the above stated dates.

#### **2. Hours of Operation**

Exterior holiday lights may be activated from **4pm - 11pm**. All lighting must be installed on properly adjusted timers.

#### **3. Additional Exterior Holiday Decorations**

Additional exterior Holiday decorations or features may not be visible from roadways, the Golf Club or other lots within the community. These items must be maintained within the 'private area' of the residence. (Items beyond standard home features and/or trees)

#### **4. Recommendations**

The Association recommends speaking with your lighting contractor about high efficiency holiday lighting products.

We recommend turning *off* the lighting power supply when not in residence.

Your lighting contractor should make the timer boxes easily accessible

**The above guidelines are applicable to Holiday lighting only. Standard Landscape lighting must still comply with the established exterior lighting criteria as described in the Community Design Guidelines.**
